Harvest Hope Africa provides opportunities to build hope for vulnerable people. Patrick and Rebecca, founders and directors are passionate about bringing restoration and transformation.

Having lived and worked in Africa for many years, they bring significant knowledge and experience. Now based in Australia, they established Harvest Hope Africa in

2019, to facilitate others joining the journey of providing opportunities for vulnerable people.

Born and raised in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Patrick witnessed the country's long history of conflict, political upheaval and instability growing up. As an adult, he lived and worked in multiple

countries in Africa. An ardent believer in the power of individual action, Patrick looks to give people who are struggling today the belief in a better tomorrow. Patrick focused his work in 1990–2012 on training leaders and working with charities to bring reconciliation and hope. He spent six years supporting the recovery of communities post the Rwandan Genocide. Patrick's formal training includes community development and education, and he fluently speaks many African languages.

As a child, growing up in Australia, Rebecca was inspired by the work of charities providing support, and promised herself that one day, she would enable transformative change in the lives of people who needed it in Africa. Patrick met Rebecca in Tanzania, where she lived and worked as a teacher trainer for nine years. During her time in Tanzania, Rebecca travelled to many African countries and through local connections and personal experience, developed a deep understanding of the needs of impoverished people in Africa. Rebecca's formal training is in education, with over 15 years of educational leadership experience.

In 2012, Patrick and Rebecca moved to Australia with their children. Their local African connections led to Harvest Hope Africa's areas of commitment. Donations to Harvest Hope Africa fund capacity-building initiatives. These programs enable the individual to become


self-sufficient, thereby creating sustainable change for the individual and their community and enabling Harvest Hope Africa to maximise their reach and impact.











In the **Democratic Republic of Congo**, Harvest Hope Africa's projects are in the eastern city of **Goma**, which has faced long standing civil war. Amongst many of the innocent victims are girls and young women. Their opportunities to access education have been affected and tragically, the experience of sexual violence has been far too common. This often leaves girls and young women alone and desperate. Alongside a locally registered charity, Harvest Hope Africa invests in training-based programs to provide a better future for these young women and their babies.

Patrick and Rebecca have been deeply moved by the encouragement, assistance and of course, donations, provided by their supporters in Australia and around the world.

Harvest Hope Africa also works in an isolated Masai area of Tanzania near Arusha, where accessing quality education nearby is not possible. The families of the school live in traditional housing in the Longido district, with access to employment, health services and clean water, difficult. The school was founded with a vision to empower the community and improve quality of life by making education accessible.

## HOW//e//ort

Our team are highly committed, with a range of expertise and significant leadership experience in Africa and Australia.

We work co-operatively with registered charities in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Tanzania, to ensure transparency and accountability, drawing on strong local knowledge and expertise.

Our programs director and project managers on the ground in Africa, bring decades of leadership experience. Our Africa programs director, Gentil Kasongo, has a master's degree in human rights, a law degree and many years experience in the Great Lakes Region as a consultant in issues of justice and human rights. Gentil works closely with Patrick to supervise our two project managers; Daniel Kalimbiro, in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Julius Rukyaa, in Tanzania. Gentil and Patrick work directly with the project managers to design projects, give clear directions regarding expenditure of finances and operational guidance. Rebecca works with Patrick and the project managers to ensure due diligence is followed as well as

providing educational and leadership advice.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Once again, I am proud to report that our operations over 2021-2022 have been extremely successful. We have continued to see growth in both finances and impact.


In the Democratic Republic of Congo, the 30 students enrolled in our sewing program graduated in February. We then facilitated their successful transition to various workplaces. I congratulate each student for the immense courage demonstrated throughout their study. They are now in position to begin their own businesses and provide for their young families.

Our sewing training program has seen significant growth in enrollments. We were thrilled to accept our third cohort of students into the program. This cohort of 42 young women is the biggest cohort we have accepted to date. Previously graduated students have become ambassadors of our program. Thanks to their witness of the benefits of our program and their professional contributions to their local community, the wider community have seen the benefits of our training. As a result, we are finding there is a high demand for our programs and have upscaled our work.

The Congolese government have seen the importance of our work and approved our training program as a recognised government training course. As a result, our students have the option to sit national exams and be provided with a government certificate of training.

Our sewing co-operative continues in Congo as a safe place for our graduating students to work and begin their own business should they wish to stay in Goma. We provide a rented premises, mentorship and quality equipment to use. Our members have increased visibility through the co-operative and are working to grow their businesses, despite the continued difficulties the pandemic brought them earlier in the financial year.

In Tanzania we have focused our efforts on supporting an isolated primary school that provides education for around 60 vulnerable children in Masailand. Prior to our support, the school had an extremely







We supported the school in Tanzania to provide salaries and further training for teachers, access to clean water on site, food, a new toilet block and teaching and learning resources. We have resourced an attached training centre for vulnerable mothers of the students, where they gain entrepreneurship training.

I particularly want to highlight our team of volunteers on the ground who work tirelessly to ensure our projects are implemented.

We honour these volunteers and are thankful. Our team of volunteers in Africa display unwavering commitment to our students and the programs that support their transformation. In particular, I welcome Gentil Kasongo to our team, as our African Programs Director. Gentil comes with a wealth of training in human rights and law, and experience in these fields. He is based in Burundi and well placed to support me to lead our team in Africa.

Meanwhile, in Australia it has been an opportunity to strengthen ties between our volunteer and donor community to our projects in Africa, and provide new ways for our local community to be a part of the impact of our work. You can read more about these initiatives in our highlights section of our report. We are so grateful for our Australian community; for those who have helped with fundraising events and made one-off or regular donations. Lives are being transformed because of our growing and faithful donor community.

Sewing Training Program, Goma

This year our third intake of students graduated! What a huge achievement for our students; teenage girls with a background of sexual violence and consequential babies, who displayed great courage as they progressed through our sewing training program. This achievement did not come without its struggles. These young women


The meal provided helps me to think clearly while I learn and my hunger pains go away.

We also received our fourth intake of 42 young women, the biggest cohort we have received to date.

Our program is gaining great attention in the local community, and it is clear there is a high demand for our programs. We have upscaled our work to cater for this need and interest.

The Congolese government have seen the importance of our work and approved our training program as a recognised government training option. As a result, our students have the option to sit national exams and be provided with a government certificate of training. So far, all students are taking up this provision.

## Psychological Therapy

To support our students' wellbeing development, we offer psychological therapy.

Students come with significant background trauma. Our psychologist, Norbert, comes once a week and is available to students who would like to have 1:1 sessions. We have prioritised this service for the younger students and those who have suffered more complex trauma.

Norbert also runs group sessions for the students focusing on common wellbeing issues. This year we have invited host families to be involved in special therapy sessions so they can learn how to be of greater support to our students in their home environment.

Having someone to talk to about what I have suffered is a gift I have never been given before. I can now move on and make a future of my life.


## Highlights IN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

We have a small group of students highlighted with leadership potential whom we have sponsored to attend university. They are progressing well and we are so proud of their determination and success to date.









#### **ELIZABETH**

### Elizabeth now in her second year of a 3 year fashion diploma.

She showed particular talent in our first intake of students. Elizabeth entered the program because she came from an extremely poor family that could not afford to send her to school. Her trainers expressed she had real talent and suggested we send her to university. What a success story.

#### **JACQUES**

#### Jacques is someone Patrick met on a past trip to Congo.

At the age of 3, during the civil war, Jacques was orphaned. The perpetrators of his parent's death were successful in attacking Jacques with machetes, which he survived with major scarring. He has been in the same orphanage his entire life. We were able to offer Jacques a scholarship to study Community Development. He is moving into his last year before his big placement.

#### **'KATERINE'**

### Finally, we have Katerine (pseudonym). Katerine has been with us for many years.

We originally met her as an 11 year old orphan with aids who wound up at the rape crisis centre. Patrick and Rebecca agreed to find her a host family and send her back to school. After many years of support and medical intervention, Katerine is now well and has graduated high school. Her host family report that she now smiles like they have never seen before. Katerine has a dream to study medicine so she can help others just like she was helped. We are making this dream come true.



#### Ebeneza Primary School

We have connected with a remote Primary School in the Longido region of Tanzania. Our families are from the Masai tribe, living in traditional housing in nearby villages. Without this independent primary school, founded by our Tanzanian project manager, Julius Rukyaa, these students would walk hours to reach the closest school. The school takes students in their first year of schooling and has two classes of around 60 students.

#### **Teacher Training Programs**

We have involved Joshua Teachers' Training College, a reputable Tanzanian teacher training college, established by The Joshua Foundation, whom our own founder, Rebecca Lubilanji worked for at the time.

Our teachers have attended intensive teacher training programs, learning strategies to teach literacy and manage student behaviour. Mentors from the College also make regular visits to the Primary School to provide feedback and advice.

I am thrilled with the progress made this year. Our children are learning, and their parents are very happy with their academic developments.

They are learning to read, this is not something our families take for granted.

#### **Food Program**

Part of the strategy to improve the health, wellbeing and learning of both students and staff, has been to introduce a food program. What a success this has been! Over the year, we have observed student's nutrition improve, and joy build. This is an essential building block to learning.

#### **Entrepreneurship Training Program**

We provide an Entrepreneurship Training Program to support vulnerable mothers of the school community who have been abandoned or widowed.

The women learn basic business and entrepreneurship skills as well as specific skills, including sewing or soap making. The women also learn about issues of health, including hygiene. This is a small program with significant potential to make an enormous impact in the lives of many more families in need.

The Primary School in Tanzania has a plethora of opportunities. Our priority will be to:

- Provide further toilets for staff and students.
- Continue to provide regular wages for staff
- Add further playground equipment
- Begin an environmental development program. This involves planting avocado trees. They will not only increase shade for the students during the extremely hot, dry summers, they will also provide fruit for the children to eat and a source of revenue for the school.
- Focus on other capital building projects, including updating the kitchen and adding a second classroom
